## **Message from the Chief of Police**

May 19<sup>th</sup> is the last day of school. Children will be walking around town during the daytime more than normal. Please be cautious when driving through town. Parents need to remind their children about being safe when walking around town. Please remind your children to stay out of the roadway when congregating with other children.

I encourage resident's to report any suspicious behavior. If you see something that does not appear to be normal (i.e., large group congregating, suspicious activity around a neighbors house when they are gone, etc.) call the police and an officer will come check it out.

Residents need to take advantage of the city wide clean up that will be held in May. This is a good program that is offered by the City of Duenweg to promote keeping the community looking good. The police department will start issuing citations for nuisance violations the week after the cleanup.
